Given the low supply of agricultural labourers, the SADC and the PDZA have joined forces to organize a breakfast conference on WWOOFing. World wide opportunities on organic farms is a program that allows travelers to work on farms in exchange for food and lodging. It is an innovative way for many people to explore the world. The breakfast was hosted by Lucie Durocher from **Ferme Paysanne RDF**, who has experience with hiring WWOOFers year-round on her farm in Cookshire-Eaton. She demystified the concept for participants, gave them precious advice and reassured them about the opportunities offered by WWOOF.
